At last count, we were involved in 10 different ceremonies. This places a huge burden on our Honor Guard manpower and equipment because they have to be in many diverse locations during a given day.

We hope everyone is doing well and in great Spirits. As we enter the peak of the Hurricane season, we are blessed not to have been the recipient of a major storm, but we need to continue to be vigilant and prepared through the end of the season. That said, we had a good month of very much needed rain.

Membership: We are at 78% membership and need to reach the goal of 102% for All American and All State by the end of the VFW year Jun 2024. Currently, we have 510 members and need 663 new annual/life members to reach that goal. We obtained two new members last month, and two for next month's total. We call upon all active members to reach out to those eligible annual members with this year's expiration date to sign up for a new or life membership. Additionally, we are planning on at least two recruitment venues to help reach this goal.

House Activities: Our Pavilion contractor has worked on placing electrical lines, outlets, and fans and installation of additional lights, rain gutters, and moving the VFW sign will be next. We were fortunate not to incur any house related issues/costs last month. A audio/video camera was set up in our members' meeting room and will soon be broadcasting our monthly meetings, possibly by next month's via zoom application. This will allow seasonal and other members who cannot attend the opportunity to view our meetings but will not be able to vote on motions. Members must be present during meetings to vote. Special thanks to our Adjutant "JR" for his expertise, making this happen, and donating equipment for this purpose.

As a TEAM, we continue to improve upon our previous administration's successes and look forward to additional house improvements and services for our Post and Auxiliary members, Veterans, and Community residents. A special thanks goes out to Auxiliary members/volunteers who perform these duties for the betterment of the Post.

Hello Friends,

The month of October has arrived and I have a couple of things to report to you about reporting! As you know I am tasked with the management of program reporting for the Post. With your help we are currently the #3 Post in the State of Florida for program reporting. This has been due to your diligence in getting information to me in a timely manner to be entered into the state dashboard. Thank you for the emails and text messages, please keep them coming!

There are a couple ways we can enter program info into the dashboard. Every one of us possesses a VFW member number (can be found on your VFW Member ID card) that can be used to log into the state dashboard. On the internet navigate to <a href="http://vfwfl.org">http://vfwfl.org</a>. Then move to the "log in" icon. Your username is your VFW member number and your password is your last name (it is not case sensitive). Once you are logged in on the website you are able to report information directly into 1 of 3 categories, "Americanism, "Community Service", and "Youth Activities." This is the most proactive way you can participate in program reporting. We have a handful of members that participate in this way and it has been very helpful to the cause. Of course, if you'd like to learn how to do it I would happy to teach you.

The other method for program reporting is compiling the needed information, number of members participating, the event and its location, date & time-then send this information directly to me either by email or text message (<u>baxter\_pk@yahoo.com</u> or text (239) 537-4111). As I receive it I enter it. Many of you prefer this method and I welcome the information. The best part of my work as Junior Vice Commander has been seeing what types of things our members are up to month to month. It's my way of getting to participate in what you are doing even if I'm not available to be out there with you fighting the good fight!

My personal goal for program reporting is to achieve the #1 spot in the state for reporting. We are a very active VFW post and I know if we were able to capture all information about what we are out in the community doing then we can achieve that goal. Remember friends, if you are at a community event, youth activity, veteran-related event and you are there representing the Veterans of Foreign Wars, in any capacity, that is data that can be captured and entered.
